This past week we saw our government at work. They could not come together on particulars that caused the Federal Government to shut down.

I am so glad we have a greater power who is solid; the power we can count on to see us through everything. The psalmist explained it so well in the

92nd Psalm. In verse 4 we are told that we will triumph in the works of the Almighty hand of God. Through this we are made glad! He speaks of the victory we will have over our enemies. Notice what he says in verses 12-15, "The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.

Those that be planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing; to shew that the Lord is upright: he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him."

The security we have in the Lord is so different than the security we have in the world. Our government officials may tell us that they are looking out for our good. But our good is based on their opinion. And sadly most of the time that is a worldview that differs from the Heavenly view.

Our Lord knows what is the very best for us. He not only wants the best, but offers the best. If I am going to flourish, if I am going to have a rock to stand on, I must trust completely in Jesus! His plans for me will always be satisfying. I will never go lacking. But notice the psalmist made it clear – I must be planted in the house of the Lord. Would you seek after Him in your life? Be planted in His house and trust His faithfulness. There is nothing like it!


